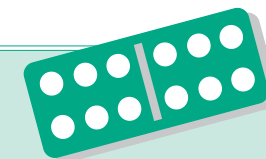

Michigan Trip

August 22-27, 2010

This trip has many unique opportunities for us. The Hampton Inn, where we spend 2 nights, is only 15 minutes away from the Ford Museum, Greenfield Village and the Ford Truck Plant. The Ford Museum has 12 acres under one roof. You will see horse-drawn vehicles, Allegheny locomotives, Presidential limousines, Heroes of the Sky, and Home Arts.

The Greenfield Village has 80 authentic buildings such as Heinz House (ketchup), Wright Cycle Shop, Thomas Edison's complex and laboratory, Noah Webster house, Robert Frost home, William Holmes-McGuffey School, working farms and an opportunity to ride in a Model T Ford.

On Tuesday, August 24, we will visit Holocaust Memorial Center and hear from a Holocaust survivor. We will also visit the largest Christmas store you will ever see in Frankenmuth, and enjoy a wonderful meal at the Bavarian Inn. Anyone who has lived in or traveled in Michigan has heard about Frankenmuth chicken!

On Wednesday we will eat at the Admiral Restaurant in Mackinaw City. After lunch we will board a ferry and enjoy a visit to Mackinac Island. Mackinac Island is a step back in time, because the only mode of transportation is a horse trolley or horse taxi. You will enjoy a leisurely walk on the island and a wonderful night at the Grand Hotel. We will have dinner there, where we will all be dressed up (men in coat and tie, ladies in Sunday dress). Thursday noon you will enjoy lunch at one of the largest buffets you will ever see.

Thursday afternoon we will return to Mackinaw City by way of the ferry. Our stay that night will be the Hamilton Inn. Friday we will begin our return to Detroit. We plan to stop at the Tanger Outlets and then on to Frankenmuth with a brief stop at Bronner's Christmas Store.

HOLY LAND / JORDAN



We will arrive in Tel Aviv on Tuesday, December 28, and visit Caesarea, ancient capital of Roman Palestine, and see the recently-excavated Hippodrome (could seat over 20,000 people) and Crusader fortress. We will continue to Tiberias and the Gal Beach Hotel on the Sea of Galilee. We will spend 4 nights here and travel the area visiting the Mount of Beatitudes and Caesarea Phillipi, where Jesus said "I will build my church." The highlight of the day will be a lunch of St. Peter's fish near the shore of the Sea of Galilee. We will visit ancient Capernaum, where the greater part of Jesus' ministry took place. We will see the first century "Jesus Boat," which was discovered in 1986. All this and more, and that is just the first day!

After 3 days, we will proceed to Jordan and visit Mount Nebo, from where Moses viewed the Promised Land, the green Jordan Valley ("the land of milk and honey"). While in Jordan we visit the marvelous "rose-red" city of Petra. The last mile of the journey is along a winding narrow path, the Sik, between two high cliffs. The entire city of rose-colored temples and amphitheatres is carved out of the multi-hued rock of the cliffs that surround its hidden valley. We will spend the night in Amman at the Regency Palace Hotel.

Monday, January 3, we visit Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered.

We continue to Masada and ascend by cable car to the magnificent ruins where Jewish defenders made the last stand of the Judean revolt against the Romans. Hopefully, time will allow you to sit in the Dead Sea and read a paper.

So much to tell in a brief space! Please pick up a brochure and ask Cliff or others about the trip. Over the years we have had over 200 from FBCD make the trip to the Holy Land, and this year we are adding the trip to Jordan.

You need to have your medical information readily available for family or even paramedics that come to assist you in an emergency. The emergency people may look in or on your refrigerator to determine your medication. They may even check your cell phone to see if you have entered contact information under ICE (In Case of Emergency) in your phone. Naturally, the person you wish to be called in case of emergency should be listed.

You need to have a Power of Attorney regarding your medical needs as well as your financial needs. Perchance you have a stroke or a heart attack; someone needs the power to act on your behalf. If a prolonged situation should occur, you may need someone to act on your behalf paying bills and taking care of necessary business matters.
